- ★ **CBTF SKILLS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM**

Adjudication for the Canadian Baton Twirling Skills Development Program will be offered.

- ★ **IMPORTANT NOTE**

The Team, Compulsory/Short Program, Freestyle, and Pair events are
CRITIQUE ONLY EVENTS

- ★ There is a Practice Area and Medical Personnel on-site.

- ★ **MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS**

TYPE A - Athletes can enter all events

TYPE B - Athletes can enter all Pre-Competitive events

TYPE G - Athletes can enter all group events

- ★ All athletes and their coaches must be registered, current members, in good standing with their own provincial organization and the CBTF

- ★ **Open Competition**

Effective January 1, 2019, the CBTF competitive program will consist of 5 levels - C, BN, BI, BA, and A.

The advancement scores (Net Score, after penalty deductions) for each level are:

Level C to BN: 2.50

Level BN to BI: 3.50

Level BI to BA: 5.00

Level BA to A: 7.00

- ★ **CBTF GRADING SYSTEM**

To follow the CBTF Long Development Model, the evaluation for Primary and Juvenile Athletes, the score determined by the judge will translate to a rating of Bronze, Silver, Gold or Diamond. Every competing athlete will earn a medal for their performance.

Level C Scores:

0.5 – 1.5 = Bronze

1.6 – 2.1 = Silver

2.2 – 2.4 = Gold

2.5+ = Diamond

Level BN Scores:

2.5 – 3.0 = Bronze

3.1 – 3.6 = Silver

3.7 – 3.9 = Gold

4.0+ = Diamond

★ MUSIC NOTES ★

- ★ Pre-Competitive and Competitive Solo, Duet, 2-Baton and 3-Baton CRITIQUES will perform to fun, chart-topping music
- ★ The Solo Dance Twirl event will perform to the IBTF Artistic Twirl music selection
- ★ The X-Strut event will perform to the IBTF X-Strut music selection
- ★ BA and A athletes may use extended time limits for Solo and 2-Baton music

Music Requirements

- ★ All team/group/freestyle/pair music must be submitted to the contact email electronically
- ★ Music must be submitted no later than January 15th, 2026
- ★ Each file should be clearly labelled following the CBTF music labelling protocol

★ AWARDS ★

- ★ Pre-Competitive Events – CBTF Ribbons
- ★ Critique Only Events – Specialty Ribbons
- ★ Competitive Individual Events – Medallions to 3rd Place
- ★ Skills Development Program – CBTF Ribbons, Badges and Pins
- ★ Specialty Awards will be handed out throughout the day

★ POLICIES ★

Refund Policy

Refunds will only be given for withdrawal from the competition for medical reasons. A medical certificate must be provided in order to receive refund.

NOTE: Athletes wearing tensor bandages, etc., at the competition are asked to provide a medical certificate PRIOR TO COMPETITION stating that the athlete can participate in the competition event. The Competition Director (in consultation with the Head Judge) has the authority to refuse to allow an athlete to compete if a medical certificate is not provided.

ERRORS or OMISSIONS on the entry form can be corrected via email.

SPLITTING OF SINGLE AGE DIVISIONS

If 16 or more athletes are competing in a single age division, the Competition Director will split divisions as deemed necessary. Groups will be split by age.

CBTF RISK MANAGEMENT POLICY

1. The Competition Director or Designate and/or the Head Judge will have the authority to stop the competition whenever a risk factor related to safety becomes evident.
2. If this situation occurs during individual competition, the competition on the lane where the situation occurs shall be stopped on that lane only by the Competition Director and/or the judge judging the event.
3. If the situation involves a medical injury or illness, the Competition Director in consultation with authorized medical personnel, shall determine whether the athlete(s) may be allowed to continue competing. The CBTF Risk Management Policy requires that a medical certificate is obtained before the athlete(s) is/are allowed to continue competing at that competition.

SCORES WILL BE FLASHED FOR OPEN COMPETITIVE EVENTS, with the exception of graded events and critique-only events. Scores will be flashed before penalties have been subtracted.

CANADIAN BATON TWIRLING FEDERATION (CBTF) RULES AND REGULATIONS EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2026, WILL BE IN EFFECT AND STRICTLY ENFORCED.

JUDGES' DECISIONS ARE FINAL.

TABULATION RESULTS ARE CONSIDERED 48 HOURS AFTER ANNOUNCEMENT OR POSTING.
